Appendix

Question 1: Where is the council infrastructure on my property?

Answer...

Wellington Water's Geographic Information System (GIS) map has been updated to reflect the positioning of the stormwater pipes (below is a snippet). Your property also contains a wastewater main.

Question 2: Confirm when all council infrastructure on my property was installed. last inspected, and any service history on it?

Answer...

According to our records, the stormwater main was installed in 1960s.

The last CCTV inspections for the council stormwater main we have in our records are:

- February 2013
- April 2022

Our records suggest that the wastewater main was installed in the 1930s.

Question 3: Are you able to supply the recent video footage of the pipe so I can see for myself its current state?

Answer...

Answer subject to requesters confirmation of preferred receipt of CCTV footage.

Question 4: Is the crack the only fault?

Answer...

Our CCTV inspection work identified that a section of the stormwater main had cracked and collapsed. It resulted in the private wastewater pipe joint dropping. This was repaired on 29 July 2022.

Question 5: What is the nature of the work required on the storm water system itself?

Answer...

Wellington Water excavated the fault on the stormwater main and installed a new section of pipe.

Question 6: Is the system, or should I say once repaired, working as it should be?

Answer...

Now the stormwater pipe has been repaired, the stormwater main is functioning as designed.

Question 7: Are Wellington Water repairing the damage to my lateral wastewater pipe at the back of my property as well as the storm water pipe?

Answer...

Yes - Wellington Water repaired the damage to the private wastewater lateral. This work was completed at the same time as the stormwater main.

Question 8: Will that include remedial work on the pathway/ground?

Answer...

Yes – the crew have been instructed to reinstate the property.

Question 9: Once we submit the receipt for the initial work, how long will it take to reimburse the money?

Answer...

Please send your request for reimbursement to <u>customer@wellingtonwater.co.nz</u>. On receipt, our Customer Resolution Administrator will be in touch regarding the required documentation for Wellington Water to consider reimbursement; this includes the invoice, bank account number, and proof of payment.

Once we have received this information, we will be able to provide you with an expected timeline.

Question 10: Regarding the 'other pipe', can you please disclose its history/any records on it?

Answer...

Our records show that we only have one set of stormwater pipes installed in this area. During our site inspections, we were not able to find any exit or entry points for this particular pipe. Therefore, we were not able to investigate this matter further using our typical methodology which would usually include dye testing and CCTV inspections.

It is likely that this is private infrastructure - you may wish to contact Wellington City Council Archives Team to see if they have any further information.

Question 11: Can you please confirm who is responsible for this pipe?

Answer...

As the unknown pipe is not related to the Council's public three water infrastructure, you may wish to engage a private contractor to investigate this matter further.

Question 12: My neighbour's lateral line goes though the area that is affected at the bottom of my property. Can you check her line and ensure there is no damage to it?

Answer...

Wellington Water provides maintenance for the council's public three waters infrastructure; this includes potable water, stormwater, and wastewater. As the neighbour's wastewater lateral is a private infrastructure asset, the property owner will need to engage a plumber to ascertain the condition of the pipe.

However, if you are referring to the council wastewater main, please let us know and we can organise a CCTV inspection of the pipe.
